Volunteers followed his path.

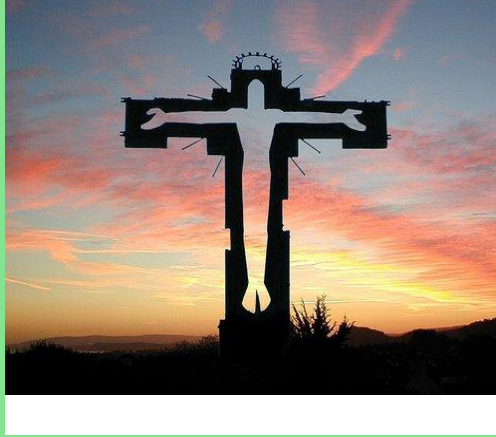
Families repeated his words.
